


# Facilitating Disaster Response and Recovery Uttarakhand



In June 2013, Uttarakhand faced large-scale destruction and losses due to flash floods

108600 people affected	580 human lives lost	5750 reported missing	4200 houses damaged
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= COORDINATION

- Soon, many actors were responding to this crisis.
- Because of the large numbers of actors, there was a need for them to converge, plan on the basis of shared information and work in coordination with each other. This coordination remained a missing link in the ongoing response efforts.
- The Govt invited UNDMT's support towards this.


