

HYGIENE PROMOTION IN EMERGENCIES

15 - 18 DECEMBER 2020 | PUNE, INDIA

About the Course

This 4-day training course prepares practitioners to address WASH and Disease Prevention needs in emergencies/disasters. This participatory course, with group exercises, practice sessions and theory based sessions, provides an overview of designing, managing and implementing Health and Hygiene Promotion in emergencies and post disaster settings.



Course Objectives

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Describe the role of Health and Hygiene Promotion in the wider emergency response context.
- List the key components and actions involved in health and hygiene promotion in post disaster settings.
- State and demonstrate community engagement approaches and techniques for WASH Programming.
- Undertake assessments to identify risk practices and design health and hygiene interventions including risk communication and messaging.
- State key considerations to be taken into account when designing disease surveillance and outbreak prevention interventions in emergencies.

Course Content- Summary

- Hygiene Improvement Framework for Disease Prevention.
- Water and sanitation programming with an emphasis on hygiene promotion.
- Tools, approaches and practices to promote safe health and hygiene practices and reduce risk behaviours.
- Introduction to behaviour change communication and development of IEC for health and hygiene promotion and practices.
- Identifying risk practices and designing messages and communication solutions.
- Use of Sphere standard for WASH programming, WASH program cycle and WASH need Assessment.
- Quality and accountability framework for WASH programming and its link with Community Participation and Community Management in WASH Programming.

Course Methodology

In this training, emphasis will be on the active learning through participatory exercises, case studies, group work, demonstrations, focused discussions and field work. Training is planned and presented in collaboration with relief agencies and specialist organisations. Informal exchange of experience and learning is a vital part of every RedR India course. Each training day involves a review and feedback component to ensure concepts, tools, and frameworks are absorbed.

Who can Participate?

The course is suitable for participants from a wide range of backgrounds interested in applying social mobilisation, behaviour change and community engagement tools and techniques for disease prevention and health promotion in disasters and emergencies; in particular, those working in WASH and Public Health sectors as field officers, coordinators or managers with development and aid agencies. Public health engineers interested in holistic understanding and skills for WASH; Programme and Desk Staff handling WASH projects with national, international and UN agencies along with government officials working in disaster zones.
